ALCON...THE BELOW SOC ENTRY IS FORWARDED FOR YOUR INFORMATION ON B.E.R.N. ACTIVITIES AS RECEIVED AND DOCUMENTED IN THE SECURITY OPERATIONS CENTER (SOC) ACTIVITY LOG ON 03 JULY 04. A COPY OF THE NSA POLICE INCIDENT REPORT WAS FORWARDED TO SOC FOR REFERENCE.

AT 0940 HRS, S/A RON V SARU, REPORTED THE BALTIMORE INTEL UNIT (BIU) ADVISED MR. MAX CBUSZEWSKI AND FOUR OTHER PROTESTERS REPRESENTING THE BALTIMORE EMERGENCY RESPONSE NETWORK (BERN) WERE ASSEMBLED AT 4800 YORK ROAD. S/A V ADVISED MR. OBUSZEWSKI WOULD BE DRIVING A SILVER BLUE DODGE MINI VAN MD TAG# 178M343. S/A V ADVISED THE PROTESTORS WOULD BE DEMONSTRATING WITH "AGAINST THE WAR" SIGNS.

****UPDATE: 1052 HRS, S/A V REPORTED TWO ADDITIONAL VEHICLES, A BLACK SATURN STATION WAGON, MD TAG# KHV 182, AND A RED COMPACT CAR (NFI) WITH MD TAG# KZJ 949. S/A V ALSO REPORTED SEVEN PROTESTORS WERE NOW ASSEMBLED AT 4800 YORK ROAD.

****UPDATE: 1131 HRS, S/A V ADVISED ANOTHER VEHICLE, A GREEN FORD STATION WAGON, MD TAG# LSL 853, WAS PARKED AT 4800 YORK ROAD AND THERE WERE NOW TEN PROTESTORS ASSEMBLED WITH ANTI-WAR SIGNS. THE SDO BRIEFED MR. GLEN S C/Q11.

****UPDATE: 1152 HRS, MR. KEMP E C/ADS&CI, CONTACTED SOC AND WAS BRIEFED BY THE SDO.

****UPDATE: 1155 HRS, S/A V ADVISED THE PROTESTORS LEFT 4800 YORK ROAD EN ROUTE TO THE NSA CAMPUS. S/A V ADVISED A POSSIBLE TWELVE PEOPLE, IN THREE SEPARATE VEHICLES, WITH AN ETA OF 25 MINUTES TO NSA. S/A V REPORTED FIVE OR SIX PEOPLE IN A BLUE VAN WITH BLACK BALLOONS, ANTI-WAR SIGNS AND A POSSIBLE HELIUM TANK. THE SECOND VEHICLE WAS IDENTIFIED AS A BRONZE COLOR FORD MERCURY MD TAG# WJP 494 OCCUPIED WITH TWO ADULTS AND A CHILD. THE THIRD VEHICLE WAS IDENTIFIED AS A GREEN FORD STATION WAGON WITH FIVE FEMALES CARRYING ANTI-WAR SIGNS.

****UPDATE: 1207 HRS, SGT H REPORTED A MINI VAN, WITH ONTARIO TAGS (APHL 384), WAS STOPPED AT THE VCC #1. THERE WERE FIVE OCCUPANTS WHO CLAIMED TO BE PROTESTORS, IN THE VAN. THE VAN WAS PARKED IN THE VCC #1 PARKING LOT AND A K9 UNIT WAS INSPECTING THE VEHICLE.

****UPDATE: 1223 HRS, THE VAN WAS INSPECTED WITH NEGATIVE RESULTS AND THE PEOPLE WERE INSTRUCTED TO MOVE THE VAN TO THE BERN STAGING AREA LOCATED AT THE COLONY 7 SHELL.

****UPDATE: 1236 HRS, THE SOC WAS ADVISED ALL VEHICLES WERE ASSEMBLED AT THE COLONY 7 SHELL AND THE PROTESTORS WERE EXITING THE VEHICLES.

****UPDATE: 1244 HRS, S/A V ADVISED THE PROTESTORS WERE INFLATING BALLOONS AND WERE PLANNING TO DEMONSTRATE AT THE NATIONAL VIGILANCE AIRPLANE MEMORIAL.

****UPDATE: 1300 HRS, THE SOC WAS ADVISED THE PROTESTORS WERE PROCEEDING TO THE AIRPLANE MEMORIAL WITH THREE HELIUM BALLOONS ATTACHED TO A BANNER THAT STATED "THOSE WHO EXCHANGE FREEDOM FOR SECURITY DESERVE IT, NEITHER WILL ULTIMATELY LOSE BOTH."

Chief,

Pursuant to your request, below is my email response annotating actions taken by me during trail on August, 23, 2004 involving the redaction of the NSAP Action Plan upon the request of Judge Gauvey. No pre trail information request was ever received, nor at anytime during or after the trail did I release any other documents other than the Action Plan. I was ordered by Judge Gauvey to provide two names, Dawn Anderson, Baltimore City Police Intel Unit and S/A John Buckley's number to the JTTF office to allow the group to contact for questions.

On or about September 10th, 2004, Q11 received a request to estimate time required to complete/cost a FOIA search request for all documents related to Baltimore Emergency Response Network, Pledge of Resistance Baltimore, and/or Jonah House. I informed [redacted] that I had retained an email file and hard copy file on all protest activities relating to the request. He requested that I hold this data for further instruction. No action was taken following up on the FOIA request from me.

After the September FOIA action, I was contacted by the OGC, [redacted] I did not retain or make note of the date of when requested was made by him for me to send my files (hard copies of all email files and other related material pertaining to protest activity) to him for review. [redacted]

[redacted] It's to be noted that the charges were dropped by the prosecutor in the end of November 2004.

Glen,

On August 23rd 2004, in front of Judge Suzan Gauvey, trail began at Federal Court in Baltimore for the defendants Marilyn Carlisle and Cynthia Farquhar. These two were part of the 14 participants involved in the October 4th 2003 protest at NSA and were subsequently charged by the military police for trespassing and failure to obey a lawful order. Ms. Carlisle elected to retain an attorney with Ms. Farquhar representing herself.

The case was prosecuted by the FM JAG's office, under direction of CPT Nelson with assistance of CPT Thomas.

Three personnel were summoned retired MP OPS Sgt Mark Bunch and NSA Police officers [redacted] & I to present the case. A situation arose where the MP's that issued the actual citations were PCS and not available for this case, yet all parties felt that this case could be tried with the data and government witnesses provided.

Testimony began with myself taking the stand and providing basic answers to the JAG's question establishing the nexus as to the police actions, authorities taken for managing this protest activity on October 4th. I was cross examined by the defense, mainly by Ms. Farquhar who was representing herself. Her line of questions asked for general data as to the mission of NSA, my knowledge of the group, how we had learned of their activity, my record keeping of this group, and questioned the ability to access the NSA/FM property.

The court discussion of two areas became of concern to the judge that she wanted clarification involving the way we had obtained this data and the "Action Plan" that I create to outline the response to this activity. In my testimony, I informed the court that the information was obtained via the MJTTF through open source data that was found on the web. This was challenged by Ms. Farquhar claiming that they did not publish this on the internet. The judge asked me to produce the method of obtaining that data and was wanting to see the "plan" in reference to the protest since she claimed the defendants have the right to have "all documents" related to their case. She allowed me time to try and call someone to obtain the data or look in any of the material I had brought with me to review and produce at which time she took a recess.

Upon returning from the recess, I produced the Action Plan and voiced concern to the prosecutor about the OPSEC issues about sharing this document with the defense since in its current state, would be harmful to our planning tactics as well as showing names and telephone numbers. In addition, the email that I had describing the coordination between NSA and the Baltimore City Police Intel unit I had concerns because it had not been cleaned to remove agency personnel names was of interest to the judge. Judge Gauvey allowed me to black out what areas I felt would be not acceptable for the protestors to see but informed me that the information directly involved with the protest needed to be made available. Thus, attempting to meet the Judge's request, I blacked out names, telephone numbers, times of deployments and removed pages directly involved with deployments supporting PSAT actions not directly related to the protest. This document was then copied and provided to all parties with the Judge retaining a clean copy ff her ability to compare the documents.

As for the email involving the police coordination between NSA and Baltimore City Police, I again blacked out names and provided this to the Judge.

The judge had requested me to provide points of contact to the defendant, Ms. Farquhar, who was asking to talk to the persons about the information they have obtained on the persons involved. I elected to deferred this action for the day and planned to met with the NSAP GC on 24 August to discuss the method to proceed.

As for the testimony of retired MP Sgt. Bunch, he provided a second aspect of the deployment and actions taken by the MP's. Lt. Jackson was called to the stand to provide his testimony as to the instructions given, plan implementation, roadway access and observations of the actions that took place during the event. Court testimony for the prosecution was concluded at approximately 1735 hours and was scheduled to resume on 24 August for the defense team to present four (4) witnesses. The JAG informed us that there was no need to return to court unless summoned by the prosecutors.

I contacted NSA GC on August 24th to discuss the case that had occurred. I meet with [redacted] and one other representative from the office that I do not recall her name at this time to discuss the issues that occurred. I provided the data above to this team [redacted]
