New video profiles cutting edge renovation Mergenthaler students inspired by Allied Health suite

Thanks to federal stimulus funding, Mergenthaler Vocational-Technical High School in Baltimore City received \$1.7 million to support its new allied health pathway. This program prepares students for employment and higher education opportunities in the growing medical industry. The city school district partnered with a local hospital to design a cutting edge health suite in a space that previously housed outdated industrial machinery.
