

Activist releases files

FBI investigations of local political groups revealed

By John Aloysius Farrell Observer Staff Writer

Annapolis black activist Carl Snowden released documents from Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) files to reporters Tuesday, which indicate the FBI has collected information on several Anne Arundel political groups during the past seven years.

Snowden, 24, a local activist who has led protest movements at the Ken Marr and Meade Village public housing projects, and has been a leader in the cause of the poor in this area, has charged that "the FBI waged an unrelentless political battle against liberals, blacks, women and human rights activists," in Anne Arundel County.

Documents released by the FBI show that the bureau gathered information, interviewed family and friends, used informants, attended demonstrations, and even clipped local newspapers while maintaining surveillance on Snowden, various county civil rights groups, and a local Democratic club.

Snowden first' requested the documents under the terms of the 1967 Freedom of Information Act over a year ago, and has filed suit in federal court to gain access to his personal file.

They show that FBI agents first began to compile information on Snowden when he was 16, and continued to add to their file right up through March, 1976, some seven years later.

Even though local agents repeatedly informed their superiors that Snowden "failed to reveal a propensity for violence," and urged that the case be closed, additional surveillance was maintained up to and including the taping of a radio show Snowden did with Stokely Carmichael, a former minister of the Black Panther Party, in March, 1976.

In addition to Snowden, the FBI collected information on several local civil rights groups such as the Annapolis teen organization Truth and Soul (now defunct), and the Poor Peoples' Rights Organization, as well as the New Democratic Coalition, a local Democratic club.

The FBI files include:

A report from the Annapolis office that a black youth whom agents identified a Snowden came to their office and called the bureau, Fat, Balding, and Ignorant, and asked for a photo of black militant H. Rap Brown. Snowden says it was not him.

[®] A notation from the local office that repeated efforts to contact Snowden during the summer of 1970 had failed, and that the case should be dropped. This report described Snowden as "a leader of Negro youth, intelligent, outspoken, immature, and not militant."

 A local newspaper clipping listing the graduates of the Key School, includ-

ing Snowden, indicating that the FBI investigation had not been dropped.

• A July, 1971 memo from local agents claiming that Snowden was not a threat. This memo was followed by an answer from FBI headquarters that the local bureau just investigate, not make conclusions, and charging the local agents to continue their investigation of Snowden.

• A follow-up letter to the local agents sent in February, 1972, which noted that "in light of the past activities of the subject and the leadership role he has shown locally among militant Negroes it is suggested that the file be opened and reviewed."

 Another local newspaper clipping showing Snowden leading a demonstration at the Ken Marr public housing project.

An "urgent" directive from the Baltimore office to the FBI Director warning that Snowden was planning a demonstration against an Annapolis appearance by the South African ambassador to the United States. This was followed by a description of the demonstration a few days later. Copies of these memos were forwarded to the State Department and the Secret Service.

• A file entry censored by the FBI so heavily that it makes no sense at all.

A June, 1974 memo to the Washington office warning that Snowden was planning a demonstration at the Naval Academy graduation ceremonies attended by then President Richard Nixon which "will reportedly touch on impeachment, Wategate, and everything in general."

A February, 1969 report which described a visit to the St. John's College campus by members of the Baltimore Black Panther Party, and which listed a female student by name who "appeared to be very friendly with BPP members," and a college instructor by name who "appeared to be sympathetic to the Panther cause."

The following letter was sent by Carl Snowden to U.S. Representative Marjorie Holt.

To Congresswoman Holt:

I am writing to you in regard to the public disclosure of the fact that the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) conducted surveillances of citizens of Anne Arundel County, and the city of Annapolis, for what many believe to have been political reasons.

Through a now pending Freedom of Information Act suit, and many requests under the aforementioned act, we have been able to learn that the FBI kept under surveillance the following groups:

- the Anne Arundel County Chapter of the New Democratic Coalition,
- Poor Peoples Rights Organization of Annapolis,
- $^{\bullet}$ A youth group called Truth and Soul,
- The Concerned Committee For Justice,
- Annapolis Senior High School students,
- Bates Junior High School students.

 and many individuals including myself.

Thousands of taxpayers' dollars was spent to investigate these groups. The documents I have, show that this surveillance began in 1970 and continued as late as April of 1976. One of the documents we have shows that the FBI transcribed an hour-long interview of a radio program called "Community Viewpoint," of which I am the host moderator, and which is broadcasted weekly over WANN radio.

In light of these new revelations, the purpose of this letter is two-fold. One, I am requesting that your office initiate an investigation into this very serious matter and in addition, that you request the U.S. Justice Department to investigate the FBI's activity here in Annapolis and Anne Arundel County, in order to determine whether the action(s) of the FBI was proper, and to insure the citizens of Anne Arundel County that the FBI will not in the future engage in this activity.

Since these revelations on the activities of the FBI, I have received numerous telephone calls from citizens all over Anne Arundel County expressing

I will gladly make available to you all documents that I have received from the FBI to date. I look forward to your earliest response. I thank you in advance for your anticipated cooperation.

H., December 12, 1970, radio broadcast over station WANN, Annapolis, Haryland, wherein CARL SHOWDEN, who described himself of a Hember Spokesman for "Truth and Soul", advised that the Concerned Committee for Justice was organized and affiliated directly with the "Truth and Soul" organization to solve some of the problems confront in the black community.

The Concerned Committee for Justice primary functions, as described as SNOWDEN, was to enable people to contact a committee locally if they feel that they had been harmssed or treated unjustly because of their race, and that this committee in turn would take the grievance to the County Human Relations Commission.

the 'Truth and Soul' organization is a non-militant organization as such, but concerns itself mainly with civil improvements of the black community in Annapolis, Maryland.

Since it has been very little activity on the part of the Concerned Committee for Justice





Armspolis, Maryland, and because it is primarily a non-militant organization, no further investigation is being conducted in this matter.

PROGRAM: Concerned Committee for Justice - Truth in Soul, Annapolis, Enryland

Man #1: Ladies and Gentlemen, my name is M.H. BLUH and I'm General Manager of these radio stations and for the next half-hour I'll be talking with three young men of the community who are in our I'd like to mention their names briefly studios. and them I'm gonna ask them to tell us a little bit about themselves before be begin out discussion. I have here a Mr. CARL SNOWDER of Annapolis. Mr. MICHAEL McCULLOUGH and Mr. MICHAEL BROWN. These gentlemen have come here today to talk about an organization, a local organization in Annapolis, called the Concerned Committee for Justice and this group is affiliated with another group here in Annapolis called, Truth in Soul, and before we begin our discussion, let's ask our guests to tell us a little about the makeup of the Concerned Committee for Justice and Truth in Soul. So let's start off by probably, we'll call on Mr. SNOWDEN. Mr. SNOWDEN.

SNOWDEN: Um. All power to the people. I'm CARL SNOWDEN from the Annapolis Community, member spokeman for Truth in

Soul and a member of the Concerned Committee for Justice. The organization Truth in Soul, um was created in hopes to better the black community. The Concerned Committee for Justice, which is affiliated with the group directly, is one of our programs set out by the group to solve some of the problems.

Nan #1: Thank you Mr. SNOWDEN. Ah. Is there anyone

who wants to add anything to that, if not, we'll

go on with the ah questions that we have here?

Gentlemen, where is the headquarters of your

organization and ah where can you be contacted?

Who might wanna answer that? Mr. Mr. McCULLOUGH.

McCULLOUGH: Yes, well the ah organization you can, the address you can get in contact with is 1385 Tyler Avenue and it's in Robinwood. Or you can call the um Office of Economic Opportunity on West Street at 268-4800.

Man #1: Thank you ah Mr. McCULLOUGH. Now could you tell
us one more thing, and that is, how many members
do you generally have, how big is your membership,
Mr. SNOWDEN?

and on the group at this present moment we have an Acting Chairman who is JOSEPHINE BROWN and also President of Truth in Soul and the group is approximately but 15 and we'll asking for members, especially in the community, the elderly members to come out and help.

the telephone number again where you might be contacted. Very well. Now, you gentlemen have ah we have ah before we started the program, we chatted about some of the things we wanted to discuss or you wanted to discuss and ah I believe we'll lead off with the question that ah a matter of community relations with the with the police department. Ah you are interested in the question as to why is there not a community police relations board that investigates grievances which might be against the police department.

Is there such an organization or do you advocate that, Mr. SNOWDEN?

SNOWDEN: Yes, we want, ah what we want to do is set up a community relations group, directly from the community which will be set up to ah where as anybody in the community who have any problems, police harassment or what have you, could go to this organization, they would check into it.

We know ah one such organization which is in the north county, northern part of the county, which has been set up and it's functioning very well and this is what we hope to start in Annapolis.

Man #1: Would you know how that operates with that police department up there? Give us a little more detail, Mr. SNOWDEN. That is, if someone is apprehended by the police you mean that ah they can go to this committee or this committee goes to the police?

SNOWDEN: What if ah for instance, somebody is ah say arrested,
unjustly and ah during the arrest, they feel that they
have been arrested unjustly. They can go to this ah
community, they can go to the community police relations

- SNOUDEN: and ah report it to them and their look into it,

 their probably go to the police department, file a

 complaint and take it from there on necessary legal
 grounds.
- Man #1: What, What in your opinion should be the, what kind of citizen should make up such a board? Who do you think ought to be on that, what kind of a cross section? Mr. SHOWDEN.
- SNOWDEN: We hope that ah the people who make it up would be young people and older people directly from the community, cause these are the people who are faced with these injustices everyday and would know how better to handle the cases.
- Man #1: Thank you Mr. SNOWDEN. Let's go onto ah another subject and that is, in your ah group here you feel that there is a need for a ah legal program, ah which would better inform citizens of their legal rights. Would you like to discuss that matter? Mr. SNOWDEN .
- SNOWDEN: Yes, umm. The what we'll hoping to do is also set up another program and all these programs will be coming directly from the Concerned Committee for Justice. Ah

SNOWDEN: this program, the way we would like to see it

(Cont.) set up, is ah group of lawyers ah people who

ah can advise on legal rights to be set up where

people can go and find out their legal rights and

also ah have some kind of free lawyers that would

take special cases and therefore move on that logic

and help the people who can't afford a lawyer.

Man #1: Hasn't there been some ah movement in that direction here in the city of Annapolis in the past couple of years, Mr. SHOWDEN that you know of? Seems I've heard something of it.

SNOWDEN: If it was it had desolved and ah what we wanna do is ah again start this organization up, get it spurred back because we find even more than ever before people do need this legal rights counsel.

Man #1: You feel that when ah people sometimes get into problems, they can't get access to legal help.

SNOVDEN: Right. Everybody should know their basic laws or the bas-- basic Constitutional rights.

Man #1: Or be able to go to some group who would help them out, is that it?

SNOVDEN: Right. right.

Man #1: Now gentlemen, I've got two more ah men here to
in the studio, lim. McCULLOUGH and him. BROWN, so
don't hesitate if you have anything that you want to add
to this. Up to this point, would any of you two
gentlemen have anything to add or we'll continue
on?

Unknown Voice: Continue

Man #1: Thank you. How, let's turn to the area of public housing and ah you your organization ah would like to discuss the ah question of who controls public housing in the public housing authority if ah we can start off with that and then we have another question.

SNOUDEM: Yes, um the question is, ah whether the people who lives in these projects or units have the ability to control these housing and if somebody is evicted from the place, who do they turn to?

Do the city help out? Who controls directly controled the housing authority and um we don't

wanna go on any specific cases but for instance if a woman why ah is evicted, say she's evicted at 8:00 in the morning, there is nobody else to turn to because in most of the communities all of houses ah all the people are filled up but having she had no She's evicted and the furniture and what relatives. have you is outside. What rights does this woman have? Is this a denial of her human rights? Is it a denial of her civil rights? We find this as an organization, we find this unjust and unjust in a way that she has no where to go. So ah we have a probable solution for this and that is to find out whose directly responsible or directly responsible to this ah housing authority.

Man #1: Mr. SNOWDEN, in that area have you had any conversation possibly to clear up those points with ah any city authority or have you thought about that, your group.

SNOWDEN: This is what the group, these questions that's being posed on air now, is hopefully will ah people that's listening who are in authority or who who have some idea on how to solve these problems, should contact us.

SHOWDEN: And again that number is 268-4800 and they can either (Cont.) leave a message with ah JOSEPHINE BROWN and ah then we'll get back in contact with them so we can solve some of these problems. We don't know who to go to and this is the main reason for being on the air.

Man #1: Yes, I understand. Uh, let's see, you did ask
the question here about ah we'll look into the,
will let's turn to another area and look, into another
part that your group ws interested in. Ah what about
the, ah the any efforts being made in the community
to keep hard narcotics out. Ah what about that area?
Let's talk about that? Your group have any thoughts
on that? Are you, anybody ah ah Mr. McCULLOUGH.

McCULLOUGH: Yes, well uh our main concern with hard narcotics getting into the community is that the um it is taking the minds of all the young, especially the young black youth in the community and we feel that um we we'll getti together to get some um some work together to stop them um dope from flowing into the community by cutting off the dope pushers from the youth of the community,

and we feel that if we can unget the dope pushers to the side and tell them that unwe want this to stop and if not, you know, the people of the community are gonna take actions against them to make to make them stop and ah which means either run them out of the community all together.

Man #1: To your knowledge, ah is there any and I'll just direct this as a general question to whom ever might wanna answer it. Is there ah ab do you think there is a big problem with narcotics in the Anhapolis community, to your knowledge? If SHOWDEN

which combats dope in the community. We won't say it a non-functioning organization, but we say that the organization is directly set up to help um dope addicts and we believe that there are people in the community that ald use this program but for some reason they are not using it and this is what we'll concerned about. As for the number of people within the community that's ah are the number are narcotic addicts, dope addicts that's in the

SNOWDEN: community, we don't know. Even if it's two or (Cont.) three of them, that's too many. We're out to smash them.

Man #1: Very well, any Mr. Brown do you have any thoughts on that? Ah do you agree hardily with that particular ----

BROWN: Right.

Man #1:--Ah comment. That out to smash them, that's that's you agree with all that your in it.

BROWN: Not with just the word smash but help.

Unknown voice: Yes

Man #1: Well, I know what Mr. Mr. SHOWDEN meant, he's right
he just wants to get rid of the dope pushers
and all that and break it all up is what he really
meant. Yes. Well, all right gentlemen let's ah
let's turn to another area now and ah we've got some
good questions here. I don't know if (laughing)
have enough time to cover them. The question of
education and it's relevancy. Ah in your opinion
is relevant education being provided in your school
system today? Who would like to take that one, ah
Mr. SHOWDEN?

I think all three of us would be able to elaborate on this, but I'll kind of start it off. as relevant education, we don't believe that school system especially in Anne Arundel County, generally speaking of Annapolis community, Annapolis High School, in particular had relevant education. Now we have to define what we mean by relevant The relevancy of it is to ah an education education. that teaches one about it's culture, about it's background and so forth. Even though they had the program set up at the school, at the high school which is a Black Studies Program, after taking a sur survey the group took ah ah survey and found out that most of the people who's taking this program don't like it for various reasons and because Mr. BROWN or Mr. McCULLOUGH whose here ah do take the Black Studies Program, he probably could elaborate on it and point out what he sees wrong with the program. Not only is we are we would like to see if they do have a functioning

SNOWDEN: Black Studies Program set up we wanna see one (Cont.)

that's set up where it's mandatory to take it
cause we understand that ah the racial situation
in Annapolis and in America is so intense that we
think that not only black students, it shouldn't be
elective because we find it mandatory that white
students should take it to understand the black culture
and the black man.

Man #1: Uh. Are there any comments, further comments Mr. McCULLOUGH.

McCULLOUGH! Ah yes. I agreed with un CARL on that point because there is no um relevant education in the schools system at all and that I wanna shoot a shot at Miss um Doctor AMDERSON, Superintendent um who is the head dictator and say dictator of Anne Arundel County Education because that's all he is. Um in the school system today, especially in the Annapolis Senior High School, um the students don't have any say whatsoever of what course they want to take or what they would like to take. So I feel that the students should have a voice. They should have students on the Anne Arundel Board of

McCULLOUGH: Education and we should have students working with the administration to have a say in what courses should be or what courses do they like or what courses the whole group of students would like to see next year, and that they could get together and work them out and see if they could really put them into action.

Now Mr. SHOWDEN just said that the Black Studies

Program should be compulsory and you mentioned that
the, you should meet with the school people and let
students decide which programs they should take.

I know you know fair is fair. Supposing that happened,
would you make all the studies, ah ah that is if they
decided they wanted it or didn't want it would that be
all right with you? Ah ah I know you didn't mean to
contradict each other but it is a natural question,
Mr. SNOWDEN.

SNOWDEN: Um. Really there is not a contradiction here. Um I

think what HICHAEL was point pointing out is um when
we meet with them see there's not no question whether

SNOWDEN: they can accept Black Studies because that's (Cont.) been proven. You know they desperately need that so that's not a contradiction. Think what MICHAEL um vanna say more is that the students should have the power, because without students there wouldn't be any school. So the student should have a say in the curriculum and um what we we understand is, especially black students because this is what the program will wanna see set up, that um you take for um instance a general education, a black child or black student who completes high school to the 12th grade, general education, has education equal to a 6th grade academic student. We find this unjust. So what we wanna do, is not only change the curriculum but also push students up to where they can be taking academic subjects, starting from first grade to 12th grade.

Man #1: Mr. BROWN did you have any um comment?

BROWN: I think the school not functioning because they

BROWN: divide the school in the community and ah allow

(Cont.) ah outside information, which is which I don't

see how they could divide the school in the community.

(inaudible)

Man #1: Um. Hold that point a minute and let's put into the hopper now another question ah along the lines we've been discussing and that is ah, in your opinion, how can the schools better relate to the community and this brings in the same phase. Mr. Mr. SNOVDEN.

SNOWDEN: I think um what Nr. BROWN was talking about is
the fact that the community and the school is
separate and they shouldn't be separate because they're
inseparable. The school is part of the community.
So his program or his idea on setting up one of these
programs is this: That um the school should be
com directly responsible to the community. When I
said directly, I mean all information, all the various
things that's happening at the school, should be
immediately reported to the community cause they
sending their kids there. Um we have quite a few

SNOWDEN: questions asked like, how many parents actually know what's happening at the school? How many parents actually know what un curriculum the kids are taking and especially it's the black parents because we understand that um sending kids to school for black people in general has been ah ah thing just to get the kids off their hands and they really haven't been a great big out-put by the community in seeking what the students ah ak are learning.

All the black parents shoul to one out and really advocate what they want to see or indicate the new changes that should go into the school.

Man #1: lir. McCULLOUGH.

McCULLOUGH: Yes, I agree with ah CARL on all those points and

I state on this that when students come into the
schools the teachers cannot understand their nature
or what their going through fixed day to day
and I say if they better if the school had better
relations with the community and they were one, they'd
be able to understand the students problems and the

McCULLOUGH: students' needs such as why a student can't

(Cont.) learn or read as fast as the other student was

he made you know, they'd be able to know whether

the student gets enough nutrition at home. You know

whether it is effecting his brain or not and if the

school knew this and the student went out in the community

and tried to correct these un these injustices because

they are injustices. Um I think the students and

the teachers will have a good thing going there.

Man #1: Thank you lir. McCULLOUGH. Mr. BROWN you have anything to add there?

BROWN: Not at this moment.

Right.

Man#1: We've touched on a question, the relevancy of education being provided in the school system and how the schools can better relate to the community and Mr. SNOUDEN, that's a pretty large area if I can go back to you again. Are there any areas that we didn't cover in your mind on that particular question?

SNOWDEN: (Clearing throat) Um, you talking about the school situation?

Man #1: Yes, school situation.

SNOWDEN: Yes um. I think ah basically, well I don't go
to the high school actually but um think what I've
been hearing from students at the high school
is like most students and especially black students
whose in their senior year, ah and this is completely
directed to them, cause I I I'm getting feed
back that they are not really interesting in seeing
the school change and I don't believe this they ca
actually believe that the school because

will graduate this year, that they can just
leave their brothers and sisters behind and say
well we made it, we'll just getting out of here.

I think to specifically keep pointing out them and
emphasizing, it's gotta be emphasized, that the
black seniors, the seniors because we think
that until black students really ah get high
education to white folk or white students that
go to that school are getting inferior education,
because ah and I come back on this

SNOWDEN: Black Studies Program. Everytime unless it become (Cont.) mandatory, the black ah white students take black studies so if ah so they can learn about the black man culture where they are ah they's pretty on the field the black man. We understand that the world or the country as it is today ah needs a lot of understanding of white people and black people. Well black people have been kearning but white people for a whole long for a long period of time. feel that white people has to turn around learn about black people because it y'd be leaving the school this year, next year, the year after and be going and in everyday life run into black people. man can respect one man if he understands that man. The man that understands that man will move on the highest logic possible and that is, loving his brother.

Man #1: Gentlemen, as long as we're on the subject of schools ah you have mentioned in our discussions the students being harassed in schools, as to why are students being harassed in schools, if they are

Man #1: and ah you also wanted to comment on the same thing harassment of citzens in the streets. Who will take that one? Who, you wanna start off Mr. SNOWDEN?

SNOVDEN: Um. Yeah well I wanna I wish to point something else then I'll go right on into that.

Man #1: Yes

SNOWDEN: We also, we we we ran across what they called the harassment we speaking of directly is un harassment in the schools. It seemed that once a person in ah school building, a citizen because that's what he is, enters the building he loses what we call the Constitutional rights or the Bill of Rights ah and we we've been questioning for a period of time what rights do students have um and and if they do have rights will the administration point out the directly what rights these rights are. We have an ultimate. Administration don't have the rights for the students we have what they call the Bill of Rights that was made up by a gentleman of the ACOU named JOHN ROMA of Baltimore and these Bill of Rights has already been

SNOWDEN: compacted and made so if the school administration

SNOWDEN: Um year yes. um The harassment in the streets generally cone from the fact that again we see cause all this is but injustices and this keep relating back to programs that we have. And ah in ah directly in the streets ah the person don't know their rights and if an officer, if we can call them that, or so-called officer, moves on harassing this

SNOWDEN: person and they don't know their rights, this is harassment and this is the injustice. This is why (Cont.) we wanna set up a program with a group of lawyers dedicated lawyers whose interested in seeing that people know their rights. 





Attached please find a copy of a report charging one Carl O. Snowden with disorderly conduct, assault and battery on a police officer and resisting arrest. The report was forwarded to the Anne Arundel County Juvenile Services Division in a routine fashion, and just recently Sue Clifford of that department had occasion to discuss this matter with me. At this time she indicated to me that she had several requests from various individuals asking that the matter be handled at the informal level.

Subject Snowden has been under police scrutiny for the past year as the leader and organizer of young militant blacks in Annapolis. Ars. Clifforn indicates that Zandling his case at an informal level might tend to impease the local militant element and prevent some racial scolems at a local level. If after reviewing this report you feel there is a substantially good case, I would be most anxious to have you assign it to one of the assistants for prosecutive action.

Snowden scores police

Activist to air spy charges

Charges by a local black community organizer that the Annapolis Police Department kept him and others under political surveillance during the 70's will be aired at a public hearing next Thursday at 7:30 p.m. in City Council chambers.

Carl O. Snowden, a black political activist and director of the county Community Action Agency's youth program, has charged that the police kept him and other blacks under surveillance and kept flies on them "for political reasons."

According to a 1971 letter from then-Deputy Police Chief Bernard Kalnoske to then-State's Attorney Raymond S. Thieme, Snowden had been under "police scrutiny for the past year as the leader and organizer of young militant. blacks in Annapolis.

Last week Kalnoske stated that he did not take part in or approve any political surveillance or files on Snowden "or any member of the black

community."

He also said that the reference to "police scrutiny" in the letter was "in connection with a series of criminal offenses that were being in-

vestigated." Kalnoske would not comment on Snowden's charges last week, and would not say whether he had a police record in 1970. At the time, Snowden,

now 22, was a juvenile.

The offenses Kalnoske mentioned include an armed robbery, an arson and two firebombing attempts.

Snowden this week denied any connection with such incidents. "My record is not the point,' he said. "I'm interested in being referred to as a leader of militants. Just what is a militant?"

Snowden says his political activities have been "nonmilitant." He has been active in the Poor People's Rights Organization, in demonstrations commemorating Martin Luther King, and in opposing a movement to block the HEW probe of county . schools.

He claims that a number of his political activities, including rallies and meetings during the early 70's, were attended by non-uniformed members of the police department.

"It is police responsibility to cover all demonstrations, crowds or rallies where there could be some confrontation," Kalnoske said last week, "it could be anything from welfare mothers to anti-abortionists.

Kalnoske and Snowden will speak at the hearing before the City Council's police Committee.
